Officially, there have been 12 different Girl Scout headquarter's addresses, but to be honest it's just basically Savannah, GA., Washington D.C., and New York City.

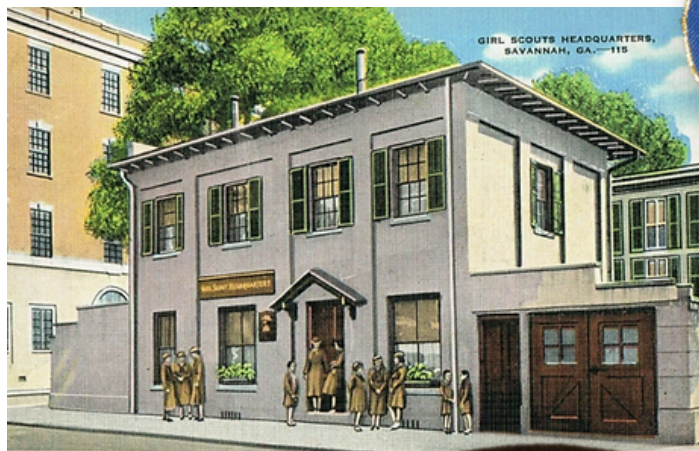
There are many wonderful items that celebrate the Low House stables as the headquarters, and certainly plenty for New York City but precious little to celebrate the Washington DC era. Even the Girl Scout Council of the Nation's Capital's Discover the Nation's Capital patch program doesn't mention that Washington D.C. was once the headquarters for Girl Scouting. It's a shame because it's in Washington D.C. years (June 1913-April 1916) that the Girl Scout movement went "national."

Scout training, it may be thought, appeals only to the younger set of girls, those from 10 to 18 years, for instance. By no means is the field barred to older girls; the inducements of leadership and captaincy are held out to them. College women, who have been trained to fill positions which require a good measure of executive ability, are being induced to give their attention to the Girl Scouts. It is pointed out that all young women who are anxious to devote their efforts to help girls will find it a very congenial field. 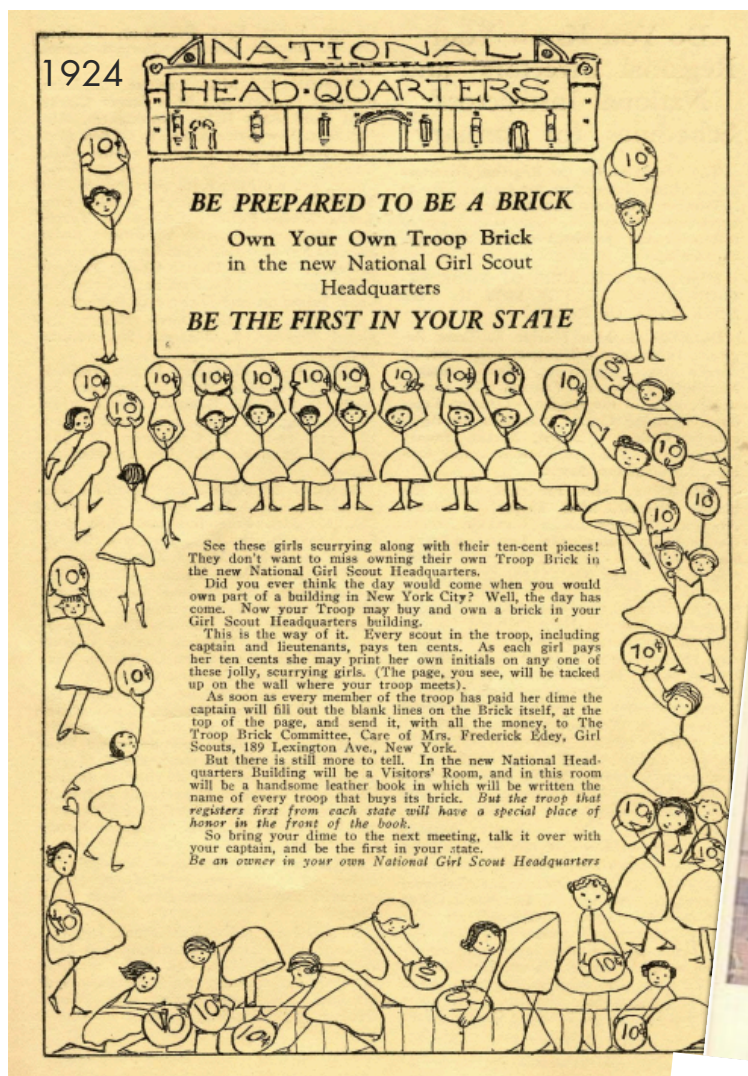

New headquarters to be built

The Girl Scouts of the U.S.A. are to have a new national headquarters building in New York City at 51st Street and Third Avenue. Construction of the building, which is designed to provide more efficient and economical service for a growing membership, is scheduled to begin this spring, but the move will not take place until next year.

The measure is expected to save money for the National Organization. Space on the street level and the entire second floor will be leased to provide income, which will help to amortize the cost of the land and the building.

Filling a plot 100' x 100', the building will have eleven full stories, and two smaller stories above the setback line. Architects' sketches indicate that it will be in the new tradition of simple, easy-to-maintain buildings designed for maximum utilization of space. The green glass used in the Third Avenue and 51st Street facades will be heat-absorbent and glare-resistant. Working space will be designed for flexibility, with movable modular partitions. The entire building will be air-conditioned and sound-proofed and will be illuminated by recessed fluorescent lights.

Full details about the new building will appear in the October issue of the *LEADER*.

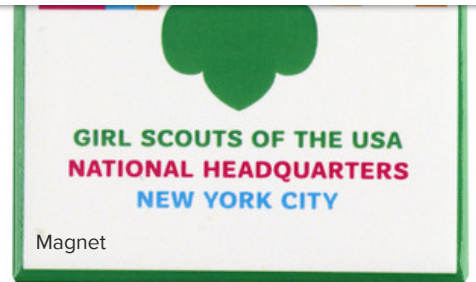
